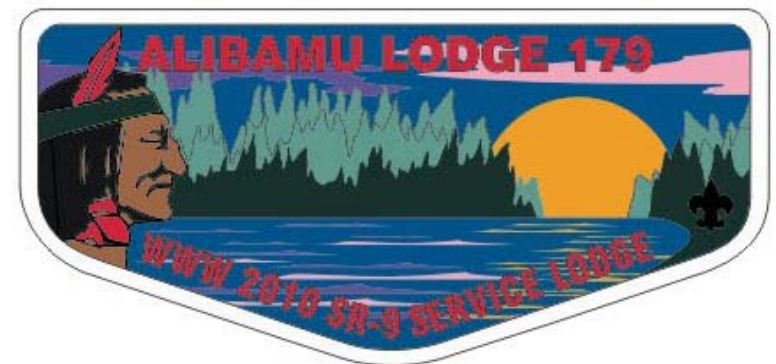

## SR 9 2010 CONCLAVE CODE OF CONDUCT

All participants and staff at the section conclave agree to abide by the following code of conduct. The general welfare of any group depends on the conduct of each individual member. This ensures the success of our section conclave and provides the maximum benefit to every participant. As an Arrowman, I understand this and support the reasonable demands of conduct expected of me.

### **As a participant of the 2010 SR 9 Conclave, and a member of the Order of the Arrow, Scouting's National Honor Society, I will:**

- (1) Observe the Scout Oath, the Scout Law and the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.
- (2) Understand that Scouting spirit and fellowship are best demonstrated by supporting the efforts of my lodge in a positive manner. I will respect the property of others, and will refrain from any inappropriate acts of ridicule, criticism or poor sportsmanship.
- (3) Confine patch trading to free time and designated areas.
- (4) Not be authorized to sell items at the conclave. I understand that the official trading post is the only source for purchasing items at the conclave.
- (5) Be personally responsible for breakage, damage or loss of property.
- (6) Respectfully observe quiet hours from midnight to 6:00 a.m.
- (7) Keep my quarters clean and dispose of trash in a proper place.
- (8) Understand that the purchase, possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs at the conclave will not be permitted and will result in immediate dismissal from the conclave. This standard shall apply to all youth and adult participants. Compliance with state and local law will apply at all times.
- (9) Follow Camp Tukabatchee's policy on smoking. Camp Tukabatchee is a smoke free property.
- (10) At all times, be a considerate guest of the service lodge and council.
