

Official Lodge Rules, Addendum I
Coosa Lodge, Order of the Arrow
Greater Alabama Council, Boy Scouts of America

Approved by LEC – 13 December 2015

Version 2016, Revision 6

I. Purpose and Scope

- a. At all times, this addendum shall be recognized as defining the official organizational structure of Coosa Lodge and its leadership for the 2016 program year.
- b. This document shall be considered null and void on 1 January 2017

II. Lodge Key 3

- a. The Coosa Lodge Key 3 shall consist of the following:
 - i. Lodge Chief
 - ii. Lodge Lay Adviser
 - iii. Lodge Staff Adviser
- b. If either adviser position is vacated at any point in the year, the Supreme Chief of the Fire, or his duly appointed representative, shall have the sole authority to appoint a new person to that position.

III. Operating Committees

- a. The following committees shall be established by the lodge, and each shall be led by a youth chairman under the age of 21. Where appropriate, multiple chairmen may be appointed to jointly lead a committee. Additionally, discrete roles may be defined within a committee where deemed necessary.
 - i. Under the oversight of the Lodge Chief:
 1. Nomination and Recognitions
 - a. Founders' Award Selection
 - b. Vigil Honor Selection
 2. Training
 3. New Member Orientation
 4. History
 5. Agents of the Arrow

- ii. Under the oversight of the Lodge Vice-Chief of Service:
 - 1. Service Corps
 - 2. Camping Promotion
 - 3. Scoutreach Mentoring
 - 4. Troop/Team OA Representatives
 - 5. Chaplains

- iii. Under the oversight of the Lodge Vice-Chief of Administration:
 - 1. Registration
 - 2. Trading Post
 - 3. Memorabilia and Design
 - 4. Finance
 - 5. Communications
 - a. Webmaster
 - b. Newsletter Editor
 - c. Annual Publications Editor
 - d. Social Media Chairman

- iv. Under the oversight of the Lodge Vice-Chief of Fellowship:
 - 1. Contingent Planning
 - 2. Fall Fellowship
 - 3. Ordeal Fellowships
 - 4. Food Service
 - 5. Coosa Shows

- v. Under the oversight of the Lodge Vice-Chief of Inductions:
 - 1. Ordeal Master
 - 2. Elangomats and Nimats
 - 3. Brotherhood Conversion
 - 4. Unit Elections

- vi. Under the oversight of the Lodge Vice-Chief of Native American Affairs
 - 1. Spring Pow-Wow
 - 2. Drum Teams
 - 3. Dancers and Dance Teams
 - 4. Ceremony Teams

- b. All committee chairmen shall be appointed by the Lodge Chief, and their respective advisers shall be appointed by either the Lodge Lay Adviser or Lodge Staff Adviser.

- c. If at any point in the program year, these committee chair positions are vacated, the lodge officer overseeing the affected committee shall assume the responsibilities of that committee until a new chairman can be appointed.

IV. Chapter Structure

- a. Chapters shall be allowed to organize themselves as they see fit. This includes the adoption of a Chapter Executive Committee and Chapter Rules. Any adopted organizational scheme shall be wholly subordinate to, superseded by, and in accordance with the Lodge Rules, the Order of the Arrow Handbook, the Guide for Officers and Advisers, and the Field Operations Guide.
- b. The chapters comprising the Lodge shall be designated as follows:

 - ii. Cahaba Chapter (Birmingham District)
 - iii. Cheaha Chapter (Cheaha District)
 - iv. Cherokee Chapter (Cherokee District)
 - v. Choctaw Chapter (Lookout Mountain District)
 - vi. Kaskanampo Chapter (Talakto District)
 - vii. Koasati Chapter (Mountain Lake District)
 - viii. Nacha Sipo Chapter (Three Rivers District)
 - ix. Nisquamawat Chapter (Arrowhead District)
 - x. Nunne Hi Chapter (Vulcan District)
 - xi. Mulberry Chapter (Mulberry District)
 - xii. Muscogee Chapter (Shelby District)
 - xiii. Sequoyah Chapter (Sequoyah District)
 - xiv. Yuchi Chapter (Westmoreland District)
